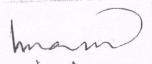

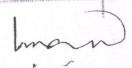

  - Introduction of the departments of Mathematics and Environmental Science
- Opening of a department for Performing Arts, Music, Dance and Drama
- Teachers need exposure to extra-regional and national level
  - Wide use of national research support schemes for UG teachers .
- Development of library with more books, journals and modern facilities
- Figner ratio of English to Hindi books in the library needed
- Separation of school and college premises urgently required
- Renovation of toilets (girls' in particular) urgently required
  - ICT and Wi-Fi facilities need to be made available to all.
