
THE THIRD LECTURE OF GURU NANAK DEV ONLINE LECTURE SERIES

- The keynote speaker of the program on this topic was Dr. Arvind Verma, Assistant Professor of Political Science, RK College, from Lalit Narayan Mithila University Darbhanga, Bihar. His educational qualification is that he is doing UGC-JRF in Political Science and Mass Communication and, UGC-NETin Gandhian Studies.
- He is an expert on"Indian Government and Politics. He has presented a number of research papers in referred International and National journal.He has attended more than 30 national & international seminar and published two books :- 1)The Dimension of Indian Politics, and 2) Rd में लोकतंत्र, राजनीति एवं सरकार Ph.D Topic स्वतंत्र भारत में भ्रष्टाचार विरोधी आंदोलन में मीडिया की भूमिका।
- He expressed his views in detail, highlighting the central state legislative relations. In a country like India which is pluralistic, federal having large area and huge population and presence of many political parties, center state relations have always been a burning question which is basis of federal governance system.
- He also discussed about the Articles 245 to 256 in which he talked about Territorial Jurisdiction (Art-245), Subject Matter Jurisdiction(Art-246), Residuary Power(Art-248), National Interest(Art-249), During Emergency(Art-250), Two or More than Two States (Art-252), and International Treaty (Art 253) and he also described about 7th Schedule in detail.
- In this lecture series Principal Dr. Sanjay Prasad and Former Principal P. Shekhar were present with Dr. Mina Malkhandi, Dr. Neeta ojha, Prof. Bishweshwari Bhattacharjee, Prof. Nitu Kumari and Prof. Namita Kumari from the Department of Political Science and 100 students of the college participated in this programs.
