Proceedings:

1. The Proceedings of the previous meeting dated 13th January 2023 were read and confirmed.
2. Issues arising out of the previous meeting:
 - a. The President and the Secretary have finalised three names out of the five names proposed by the governing council, in consultation with the repsents. The three names were:

All the above-experts were asked to come to attend the Selection Committee meeting, which they accepted, for the post of Principal in our college on 2nd May 2023 at 9:30 am. A letter from the Secretary of the college was sent to all the three-experts.

3. The audit report of the second quarter for the financial year 2022-23 was presented and approved.

4. A two-day National Seminar on Atmanirbhar Bharat: Towards Self Reliant India was organised on 10th & 11th Feb '23 by the Department of Economics of the college in a successful manner. Detailed Report is available on the college website: www.gacollege.org

5. A letter/ Notice dt. 16.03.2023 received on 25.03.2023 from the office of Assistant Labour Commissioner regarding Complaint lodged by Smt. Dayawanti Kumari and

four retired non-teaching staff of the College, was placed by the Principal for discussion. The complaint was mainly related to non-payment of salary, subsistence allowances and gratuity by the college management. In this context the principal apprised that after retirement all retiral benefits - Provident Fund: Employees and Employers Contribution with interest have already been paid to all the complainants but for Kulwant Singh husband of Late Gurmest Kaur. The Principal apprised that the Labour Commissioner, through this letter, has asked the college authority to be present before him on 22.04.2023 at 11:30 am with all relevant documents related to retiral benefits.

He also informed the governing Council that, in consultation with the President and the Secretary, the case was handed over to Sri. Pinto Mandal, Lawyers who will represent our college on 22.04.2023 with all relevant documents and observations.

6. A Pleadere's legal notice dated 13.02.2023 served by the Lawyer, Sri. Bimendra Kumar on behalf of Kulwant Singh husband of Late Gurmest Kaur, Daya-wanti Kumari, Wife of Late Shadurgham Prasad, Indiaz Ahmad, Rajendra Prasad Mahato and Binibala Dutta, all retired non-teaching staff of the college, was placed before the governing council and discussed at length. Through the ~~letter~~ legal notice, the complainant demanded payment of gratuity amount

of Rs. 100000/- . The matter was brought to the notice of the President and the Secretary, and it was decided to hand over the case to Sri. S.P. Bhattacharya, Lawyer at District Court, Dhanbad for compliance on behalf of College. The reply of the pleader's notice was sent by him to all the complainants and the Lawyer, Sri. Bisandra Kumar on. 6.4.2023 duly signed by the Secretary of the College. The reply letter was placed before the governing council by the Principal.

7. The Principal placed a letter from Binod Bihari Mahto Koylamehal University, Dhanbad asking colleges to deposit 20% of receipts from vocational courses, in our case BSA and BBA, to the university account. The University has also sent a reminder to deposit 20% of the receipt from vocational courses at the earliest.

In this regard, the Principal apprised that the college has paid the inspection fee for the inspection fee for grant of affiliation to all vocational courses as and when demanded by the University. Recently, the college has paid Rs. 75000/- towards inspection fee for extension of affiliation for BBA course. Last year ^{the} college paid only Rs. 30000/- to the University for the same exercise. Also, there is no provision of depositing 20% of receipt from vocational courses. All things taken into account, it was resolved not to pay any amount of receipt from vocational courses to the University.

8. The Principal apprised the members of the governing council about the fewer number of enrolled students in Psychology Major & Minor in both campuses. He proposed that in view of fewer admissions of girls & boys to Psychology, this course/subject be allowed to function only at one place i.e. in Bheda Campus (Co-ed) from next academic session 2023-24. The proposal was approved.

9. The budget for the financial year 2023-24 was placed before the governing Council. After going through it in detail, the budget was passed and approved.

With no other matter at hand the meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair.
